Some ways you can bless others with your talents

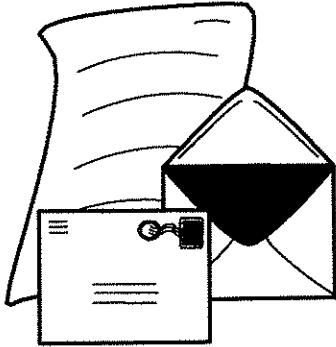
1. Share your writing gifts by contributing to the newsletter

Did you know that the CFVC has the largest transitional housing complex in the United States for the victims of family violence?

While that is a sad statistic in some ways, it is also a positive effort in our community to combat Family Violence and give those harmed by violence a chance to start anew and to heal.

The CFVC complex has apartments and group housing. The goal is to help these women and children recover from their trauma and build healthy new lives. They do counseling, job training, and mentoring.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

DONATE: They always need:

Paper products
Laundry detergent
Cleaning supplies
Diapers and baby supplies
Large garbage bags
Over the counter medicines
Non perishable foods

Just call them at 770-479-1804 to arrange a time to bring your donated goods.

From time to time they have a need for furniture and other items as well, including clothing.

VOLUNTEER:

1. Tutors needed for all grades-contact Kathi at 770-479-1804 x 207
2. Middle/High school program (currently there are over 20 children in this age group living in the complex who need attention). Call and ask about this program.
3. Boy's mentoring program. They need men willing to devote at least one hour (come on guys, one hour!) every two weeks to mentor a boy who needs a Godly male influence.
